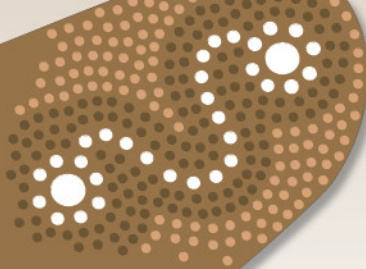


# DISCOVER THE Australian Zone
