Red Ruffed Lemurs
(Gibbon Island, Singapore Zoo)

These critically endangered furry twins were born on 22 Feb 2020. Their dad Bosco was the last Red Ruffed Lemur baby Singapore Zoo welcomed 11 years ago.



Goodfellow's Tree Roo
(Australasia, Singapore Zoo)

This adorable Joey is the firstborn of Father Makaia and Mother Nupela. As of Oct 2020, there are 57 of these endangered animals under human care worldwide!



White Rhino
(Wild Africa, Singapore Zoo)

Pygmy Hippo
(Pygmy Hippo Exhibit, Singapore Zoo)

Celebes Crested Macaque

On the morning of 3rd July 2020, our keepers were proud to welcome our newest baby macaque, Joyo, which means "Victorious" in Bahasa Indonesia.



Hamadryas Baboon
(Great Rift Valley of Ethiopia, Singapore Zoo)

Hamadryas baboon babies have black fur unlike their brown-furred parents. Spot the energetic little ones playing or clinging to their mums.



Wallaby
(Wallaby Trail, Night Safari)

Did you know a baby wallaby is called a joey? Look out for our wallaby joeys peeking out of their mums' pouches!



Malayan Tapir
(Tram Trail, Night Safari)

Bintang means "star" in Malay and he is the first male tapir born in Night Safari in close to a decade. He was born on 28 June and weighed 10kg at birth.




Asian Elephant
(Tram Trail, Night Safari)

Playful Neha is the youngest of the 6 Asian elephants in Night Safari. Her father, Chawang, is the Night Safari park icon.



Indian Crested Porcupine
(East Lodge Trail, Night Safari)

Porcupine babies are called porcupettes! They are born with soft quills which harden within a few days.



Bali Myna
(Wings of Asia, Jurong Bird Park)

These beautiful white birds with their long head plumes are severely threatened in the wild. We breed them as part of efforts to create a healthy population under human care.



Blue-eyed cockatoo
(Parrot Paradise, Jurong Bird Park)

These rare birds are difficult to breed under human care. Their keepers were overjoyed to hatch three chicks this year!



Agouti
(Squirrel Monkey Forest, River Safari)

Pronounced as Ah-Goo-Ti, newborn agoutis can run one hour after they are born! How amazing!



Manatee
(Amazon Flooded Forest, River Safari)

There are currently 3 manatee babies at River Safari. Two of them belong to first time mums, Joella and River Safari's park icon Canola, who happen to be best friends.
